#### Salisbury Steak With Mushroom Gravy



#### Ingredients

- 1 ½ pounds ground chuck (Jumbo Pack on sale \$1.99lb!)
- ½ cup Italian style dry bread crumbs
- 1 large egg, beaten
- ½ cup minced onion
- Couple of dashes Worcestershire sauce
- 2 cans condensed cream of mushroom soup, divided
- Cajun seasoning (like Slap Ya Mama), or seasoning salt (like Lawry's), to taste.
- 2 tbsp. bacon fat, canola, or vegetable oil
- Couple dashes Kitchen Bouquet, for color, optional
- 2 cups sliced mushrooms

#### **Directions**

• Mix together the ground beef, bread crumbs, beaten egg, onion, Worcestershire sauce and 1/4 cup of the soup. Shape into 6 oval shaped patties, and sprinkle both sides of the patties with Cajun seasoning or seasoned salt. Heat the fat in a 12 inch skillet over medium high heat, add the patties in two batches, and brown on both sides, turning carefully. Use a wide spatula to transfer the patties to a platter; set aside. Drain off excess fat from the skillet.

• Add the remaining soup to the skillet and bring to a boil; reduce heat, stir in Kitchen Bouquet and the mushrooms, cover and cook for about 2 to 3 minutes, or until mushrooms release their liquid. Return the patties to the skillet, carefully turning to coat both sides, cover and cook over medium low, turning several times, for about 30 minutes or until patties are no longer pink. Serve patties with some of the gravy and mushrooms spooned over the top.

#### •~Cook's Notes~

If you are using a higher fat ground beef, increase the dry breads crumbs slightly. For extra gravy use three cans of cream of mushroom and stir in a bit of water or milk to loosen, bring to a boil, add mushrooms and proceed with remaining recipe. Can also substitute a 6-ounce can of mushrooms with the liquid for the fresh mushrooms.

### FM 2025 Speed Increase The speed limit increase along FM 2025 in San Jacinto County is now

The speed limit increase along FM 2025 in San Jacinto County is now effective. The new signs were ordered after the Texas Transportation Commission approved the speed increase on September 24th and arrived in San Jacinto County on December 17th. The signs were put in place on December 18th making the new increased speed limit official.

Since taking office on January 1, 2015, San Jacinto County Judge John Lovett has been working with officials from the Texas Department of Transportation, TxDOT, to increase the speed limit on FM 2025. Those efforts came to fruition on September 24, 2015 when the Transportation Commission in Austin voted to approve a speed limit increase of 5 miles per hour for FM 2025 for most of the length of the road from New Hope to the Highway 150 intersection. The new speed limit will be 60 miles per hour.

Judge Lovett is very pleased and thankful to The Texas Department of Transportation for their consideration and efforts in working with the county to meet the needs of our residents.



# 197796'S BOOK Shelf

JULIE KAGAWA

The Iron King by Julie Kagawa 363 pages

Genre: Young Adult/Fantasy

Summary: My name is Meghan Chase.
In less than 24 hours I'll be sixteen.
Countless stories, songs and poems have been written about this wonderful age. When a girl finds true love and the stars shine for her and the handsome prince carries her off into the sunset. I don't think it will be that way for me.

Something has always felt slightly off in Meghan's life, ever since her

father disappeared before her eyes when she was six. She has never quite fit in at school or at home.

When a dark stranger begins watching her from afar, and her prankster best friend becomes strangely protective of her, Meghan senses that everything she's known is about to change.

But she could never have guessed the truth - that she is the daughter of a mythical faery king and is a pawn in a deadly war. Now Meghan will learn just how far she'll go to save someone she cares about, to stop a mysterious evil, no faery creature dare face; and to find love with a young prince who might rather see her dead than let her touch his icy heart.

**My Review:** While this book did not win my favor over Kagawa's The Immortal Rules, it was still an enjoyable read...just not a very memorable one. Meghan definitely wasn't one of my favorite heroines. Every time she started impressing me and proving she had a good head on her shoulders, she would do something eye-roll worthy like make a deal with a fairy creature, even though she was literally just told not to, and she had a highly annoying knack of not getting out of the way when scary fey monsters were coming right at her. Plus there's the whole love triangle thing where she, go-figure, is immediately drawn to the cocky, bad-boy fairy. Personally, I would be much more interested in the hilarious, sweet, best-friend fairy. Sigh. It's a shame telling fictional characters what to do never works.

My favorite characters in the book by far were Robin AKA Puck (the aforementioned hilarious best friend fairy) aaaand...drumroll please... Grimalkin! A magical fey-cat with witty comebacks and outstanding use or sarcasm? He's an animal after my own heart.

Overall, I enjoyed The Iron King, and I'm glad I read it. It was entertaining, but I don't really feel an overwhelming urge to continue the series.

**Stand alone or Series:** This is the first book in *The Iron Fey* series. It is followed by *The Iron Daughter*, *The Iron Queen* and *The Iron Knight*. It also has several novellas as well as a spin-off series that takes place over 10 years later and revolves around Meghan's little brother, Ethan, called *The Iron Fey: Call of the Forgotten*.
