HELP the San Jacinto County Appraisal District Give You Some Relief on your 2018 Property Taxes from Hurricane Harvey Damages

The Texas Property Tax Code allows local governmental entities to authorize Appraisal Districts to reappraise property inside a declared disaster area. A reappraisal of property affected by the recent flooding will be conducted if requested by the local taxing entities.

A major portion of this process involves assistance by the property owners. Please submit evidence expedite the potential future reappraisal.

Evidence must be brought in to San Jacinto County Appraisal District and can include any of the following: Photos of Damage, Insurance Estimates, Contractor Estimates, Receipts for Repairs, FEMA Documents or any related repair costs due to disaster damage.

Please complete a Hurricane Harvey Damage Survey and attach it to the evidence being provided to San Jacinto County Appraisal District. A copy of the Survey can be obtained through our website, www.sjcad.org or in our office at 99 Slade Street, Coldspring, Texas 77331.

Shepherd ISD Earns State's Highest Fiscal Accountability Rating

Shepherd Independent School District officials announced that the district received a rating of "Superior Achievement" under Texas' Schools FIRST financial accountability rating system. The Superior Achievement rating is the state's highest, demonstrating the quality of Shepherd ISD's financial management and reporting system. The FIRST (Financial Accountability Rating System of Texas), is a financial accountability system for Texas school districts developed by the Texas Education Agency in response to Senate Bill 875 of the 76th Texas Legislature in 1999. The primary goal of Schools FIRST is to achieve quality performance in the management of school districts' financial resources, a goal made more significant due to the complexity of accounting associated with Texas' school finance system.

This rating shows that Shepherd's schools are accountable not only for student learning, but also for achieving these results cost-effectively and efficiently. The Schools FIRST accountability rating system assigns one of four financial accountability ratings to Texas school districts, with the highest being "Superior Achievement," followed by "Above-Standard Achievement," "Meets Standard Achievement" and "Substandard Achievement." Districts with serious data quality problems may receive the additional rating of "Suspended –Data Quality." Districts that receive the "Substandard Achievement" or "Suspended – Data Quality" ratings under Schools FIRST must file a corrective action plan with the Texas Education Agency.

BACON-WRAPPED CHEESE STUFFED CHICKEN

Ingredients:

- 4 ounces cream cheese, softened (Kraft soft cream cheese 7.5-8 oz. on sale 2/\$5.00!)
- 1/2 cup cheddar cheese, shredded (Crystal Farms shredded or chunk cheese 8 oz. on sale 2/\$4.00!)
- 1 pound boneless, skinless chicken breasts (Family Pack on sale \$1.29lb!)
- 8 slices thin cut bacon (Rath bacon 12 oz. on sale 2/\$7.00!)
- Paprika to taste
- 1 tablespoon fresh parsley, choppe

Directions:

- In a bowl, combine cream cheese and cheddar cheese. Form into about 2 to 3-inch length and 1/2-inch thickness (make sure they will fit the cut you make on the chicken).
- Wrap each cheese log in plastic film and freeze for about 10 to 15 minutes or until firm.
- Trim chicken of any excess fat. Make a small slit on top of meat, but not cutting all the way through.
- Insert cheese log into the slit.
- Wrap chicken with bacon and place in a single layer in a cast iron skillet or baking dish.
- Season with paprika to taste and sprinkle with chopped parsley. • Bake in a 400 F oven for about 30 to 35 minutes or until thermometer inserted in center of chicken reads 165 F.
- Broil for about 1 to 2 minutes or until bacon crisps. Serve hot.
