FFA Students Attend National FFA Convention



Did you know that Tanning and Treasures is now Southern Tanz Boutique? The new owner is Keri Vidrine and she has expanded the tanning services to include Spray Tanning. I learned a lot more about tanning when I talked with her the other day. Keri has regular lay down beds and stand up beds for people who want the normal tanning routine. Each session lasts 20 minutes and Texas law states there must be 24 hours between tans, so once a day is the most tanning you can have! Lay down beds are more relaxing and cost \$6 a session, while stand up beds are \$8 a session and give you a faster or stronger tan. If you would like to have regular tans, you can have a monthly rate of \$40 or \$60 for the stand up bed tan.

Spray tanning, or air brush tanning, is just that. You are sprayed with a special solution that will last 10 days or so and will give you the perfect tan. This is a great way to go for people wanting to look their best for the special occasion. It could be a wedding, a prom night, a cheerleader session or any event where looking good is desired. The solution is organic and contains collagen, skin tighteners, vitamin E and is very safe. It takes about 10 minutes to have your spray tan completed and the price is less than half what it costs for the same treatment in Houston where it costs about \$45. Southern Tanz Boutique charges \$20.

What else? The Boutique has a fine collection of handbags, jewelry and rustic home decor. I bought a pair of sunglasses with 'bling' decorating the sides! 

Rub turkey with salt and oleo (shortening or butter).

Place in a roaster. Add 3 cups of water.

Cover with roaster lid and place in preheated 450 oven. (Our grandmothe) vould also use just a aluminum roasting pan, put the turkey in the pan and then put the entire thing into a brown paper bag and wrap it up tight before putting it in the oven. This is the way I remember seeing our dad do it as well! HOWEVER, I read that paper can catch fire at 451 degrees—so you may want to bump down the thermostat a bit if you use this method, just to be safe! And make sure the bag isn't touching the sides or top of the oven. Bake for 1hr 15min.

Turn off oven but DO NOT PEEK, leave it in the oven all night and open at noon the next day! (We didn't have a ton of people to feed a Thanksgiving, so I'm thinking this is based on a 10-12lb turkey. If you ave a bigger turkey, you may want to roast it a little longer.)




