

BOOK REVIEW BY ROB MARSH

Martin Luther: A Man Who Changed the World

In time for the Reformation season (and one year away from the 500 year anniversary the Protestant Reformation in 2017) I would recommend the illustrated book "Martin Luther: A Man Who Changed



World". Written by Paul Maier, this serves as a good introduction to the life and works of the man who was used greatly by God to bring about reformation to the world. Featuring colorful paintings by Greg Copeland depicting various scenes throughout Luther's life, the text is a good primer on the life of Luther. We learn about his early life, his conversion and ultimately his critical discovery that Scripture teaches salvation is a free gift of God, that God's righteousness is a gift to those who repent of their sins and believe in Christ and is not based on a false foundation of worksrighteousness. On October 31, 1517 Luther wrote his 95 theses in which he challenged the teachings of Rome on purgatory, indulgences and other false teachings then nailed these teachings to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg. From this act the Reformation was born. Mair goes on to tell the narrative of other events in Luther's life, such as fleeing for his life from the dangerous threats of Rome, his daring rescue by friends, and his efforts to translate the Bible (the only Bibles at that time being in Latin, a language that most people couldn't read) as well as his marriage, family life, and how he redeemed his time for the glory of God in his works and writing. With advances at that point in history in printing press technology he was able to produce various writings, catechisms and hymns, helping many to learn about God's Word. This text is beautifully illustrated and informative, and while not completely thorough of all events of Martin Luther's life it does present an excellent overview of who he was and how God used him mightily.



Directions

 Preheat oven to 350°F. Coat 8 ½ x 11-inch rimmed baking dish with nonstick spray. • In small saucepan over medium-high heat, melt butter until it foams. Once foaming has subsided, add flour and cook 1 minute, stirring constantly

- Repeat with remaining tortillas.
- Pour remaining enchilada sauce over rolled enchiladas and sprinkle with
- Bake until cheese is hot and bubbly, about 25 to 30 minutes. Remove from oven and let stand 5 minutes. Garnish with scallions and serve.
