### Will You Be Ready if Disaster Strikes?

Do you know how to prepare your family for a disaster? The following are a few things you can do that will help prepare you and your family.

- 1. Make sure you and your family have a meeting place if all of you get separated. 2. Make sure you have all of your important medical records and important documents together in a waterproof bag.
- 3. Make sure you have food for you and your family and other supplies for at least 2 weeks.
- 4. Make sure you have an emergency supply kit full of everything from flashlight to first aid kits and cash.
- **5.** Take an inventory or video of the contents of your home and valuables to use in the event of a claim.

#### Things you and your family can do to prevent yourselves from harm.

- 1. If you know that a hazard will affect your home, do not hesitate, take your family to a safe area.
- **2.** If you come upon flood waters. Turn around don't drown.
- Things you can do if damages to your home have occurred: 1. Document your home before and after a disaster.
- 2. If you have homeowners insurance contact your insurance provider
- about your damages. **3.** Contact your local Emergency Manager with your damages.
- **4.** Be prepared for the unexpected.

The local commission is responsible for the identification and preservation of locally significant historical landmarks and treasurers, as outlined in the Texas Local Government Code, chapter 318






#### It Ends With Us

**SUMMARY:** Preventing heart from forgiving someone you love is actually a hell of a lot harder than simply forgiving them.

Lily hasn't always had it easy, but that's never stopped from working hard for the life she wants. She's come a long way from the small town in Maine where she grew up - she graduated from college, moved to Boston, and started her own business. So when she feels a spark with



a gorgeous neurosurgeon named Ryle Kincaid, everything in Lily's life suddenly seems almost too good to be true.

Ryle is assertive, stubborn, and maybe even a little arrogant. He's also sensitive, brilliant, and has a total soft spot for Lily, but Ryle's complete aversion to relationships is disturbing.

As questions about her new relationship overwhelm her, so do thoughts of Atlas Corrigan—her first love and a link to the past she left behind. He was her kindred spirit, her protector. When Atlas suddenly reappears, everything Lily has built with Ryle is threatened.

MY REVIEW: I have so many emotions right now after finishing this book that it's hard to know where to start. But I think everyone (of appropriate age) should read this book. That's right, everyone.

I could easily give everything away. I could, but I won't. If you go looking for lots of reviews, it won't be hard to work out what this book is about. And if you, you should still read it, but I think it's better if you don't. I think it's better to go into this book knowing as little as possible. But I will say that this is an extremely powerful story and I don't think it will be what most people are expecting. I know it wasn't for me.

We experience everything through Lily's eyes. When she falls in love, we fall in love; when she gets her heart broken, our heart is broken; when she gets it all wrong, so do we.

Nothing in this book is black and white, it is so filled with gray areas and so deep and complex and, therefore, far more emotional. It peels back the layers of characters and relationships to do something that so many other authors have tried and failed to do - to make you understand a situation that for most people makes no sense. It's very sad, painful and exceptionally honest. My heart hurt while reading it and I almost cried several times.

Colleen Hoover really knew the 16-25 year old female audience she was writing for when she made Lily's best friend Alyssa. Heck, I want her to be my best friend. She's just so quirky and funny and she says the absolute best line of the entire book, that I so wish I could quote for you now, but it would be a huge spoiler, and I refuse to allow myself to do that.

I thought this book was excellent, and if your age 16 and over I think you should give this a chance. And also, if you're going to take my advice about starting this book not having a clue what it's about, STOP READING at the end of this sentence, because the Parental Guidance will give too much away.


