San Jacinto County Completes Community Wildfire "Our county is growing at a pace much greater **Protection Plan**

San Jacinto County has developed a plan that will better prepare the community for wildfires.

The Community Wildfire Protection Plan is the 18th countywide CWPP in Texas. It was developed by San Jacinto County officials, local volunteer fire departments, emergency service districts personnel, representatives from the Sam Houston National Forest and Texas A&M Forest Service. San Jacinto County applied for the Statewide Community Wildfire Protection Grant and upon completion of the CWPP, was awarded \$10,000. The grant, administered by Texas funded to provide for writing and producing a communitywide protection plan and mitigation

ecosystems through wildfires awareness programs and and minimizing the number of Commissioner's Court meeting at the San Jacinto County Courthouse Feb. homes destroyed by wildfires.

In a statement San Jacinto County Judge John Lovett said:

The creation of this plan will enable our VFD's and emergency personnel to acquire the tools needed to increase response times, thus lowering insurance rates throughout the county. I cannot thank my Special Programs Coordinator,

Sandra Lantz, enough for her tireless efforts in creating our CWPP. The long-term benefits of this plan will be immeasurable. 

Ingredients:

• 6 boneless pork chops (boneless center cut pork chops on sale \$2.39lb!) • 2 small to medium onions, chopped

(white onions on sale 2lbs/\$0.99!)

• 2 tablespoons butter (Imperial margarine tub 45oz on sale \$1.79!)

• 4 cups potatoes, sliced very thin (mandolin recommended) (5lb bag

russet potatoes on sale 2/\$3.00!)

• 1 can (10.75 oz.) cream of mushroom soup • 1 1/4 cups of milk

Directions:

• Preheat oven to 350 degrees F

• Butter or spray a 2-quart baking dish (11 x 7-inches) • Heat a large skillet over medium-high heat.

• Melt 1 tbsp. of the butter in the pan

• Brown pork chops on both sides; remove from pan and set aside.

• Add the remaining 1 tbsp. butter to the skillet and add the chopped onion.

• Cook onions until they are soft. • In the same pan as the onions, add the condensed soup and gradually stir

in the milk so you don't get lumps; set aside.

• Slice potatoes and place in an even layer in the prepared baking dish.

• Place pork chops on top of potatoes • Pour soup mixture over pork chops. Wiggle the pan a bit so the sauce

distributes throughout the pan.

• Cover and bake at 350 degrees F for 30 minutes.

• Remove cover and bake for an additional 30-40 minutes.

For Slow Cooker:

• Follow recipe up until sautéing onions and making the soup sauce

• Place sliced potatoes in the buttered crock of the slow cooker

• Place pork chops on top of potatoes. • Pour soup mixture over chops

• Cover and cook for about 3-4 hours high 5-7 hours low
