On Saturday night at approximately 7:30 p.m., a man attempted suicide by hanging himself from the FM-1988 and US-59 overpass. The sequence of events are as follows. A woman spotted the man at the edge of the bridge with a rope around his neck. She reported to the Polk County Sheriff's Office. The Sheriff's Office radioed the situation to deputies. Trooper Kevin Burman (with the Texas Highway Patrol) heard the transmission and immediately proceeded to the scene (from US-190 East). Trooper Burman got there within 3 minutes (first person on the scene). Purmen ran to the rope and observed the man the scene). Burman ran to the rope and observed the man hanging by the neck over the bridge (The rope was tied to the truck). Burman was quickly joined by Sergeant David Ramsey with the Polk County Sheriff's Office. Within seconds, a Park Ranger pulled up to the scene. All this while Burman and Ramsey are trying to pull the man back up. The Park Ranger (we don't have his name) jumped into the truck and helped pull the man back up. The man had no pulse and wasn't breathing. CPR was administered and the man was resuscitated. At time of press, the man is still alive.

- AVOCADO CREMA Ingredients: pound tilapia fillets (on sale \$1.99lb!)
- 1 tablespoon chili powder
- 1 teaspoon cumin
- 1 teaspoon cayenne pepper • ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon black pepper
- 1 tablespoon lime juice (about 1 lime) • 1 tablespoon olive oil

FOR THE AVOCADO CREMA • 1 avocado

- ½ cup cilantro, roughly chopped
- (on sale 3/\$1.00ea)
- ½ teaspoon salt • ½ teaspoon black pepper
- 1 tablespoon lime juice (about 1 lime) • 1/4 cup sour cream

Directions:

- Preheat oven to 400°F/200°C.
- In a small bowl, mix the chili
- powder, cumin, cayenne, salt, and pepper with the lime juice and olive oil. • Using a basting brush, generously coat each side of the tilapia fillet with the marinade.
- Bake fish for 12 minutes in a preheated oven until edges begin to crisp and fish is moist and flaky.
- While fish is baking, prepare the crema. In a blender, combine avocado, cilantro, salt, pepper, lime juice, and yogurt. Blend until mixture is smooth.
- Serve tilapia topped with avocado crema and freshly chopped cilantro. Enjoy!


