

Suspected Drug Money Seized in Arrest



A traffic stop on US 59 at FM 2025 in Cleveland Thursday morning resulted in \$177,020 in cash being seized.


Around 9:00 a.m., deputies with the Liberty County Sheriff's Office Criminal Interdiction Unit pulled over a 2015 Jeep with out-of-state license plate that reportedly made multiple traffic violations.

While speaking to the driver of the vehicle, Lyle Billison, 24, of San Antonio, deputies became suspicious of Billison's travel plans and asked to search his vehicle. He reportedly complied, according to a statement from the sheriff's office.

Inside the vehicle, deputies reportedly located a duffel bag in the rear cargo area that contained \$177,020 in U.S. currency. "Billison did not claim the money nor did he claim to know from where the money originated," the statement continues.

He was charged with the second-degree felony of Money Laundering and was placed in the Liberty County Jail where his bond was set at \$100,000.

Two suspects Reportedly Caught **Dumping Materials in Sam Houston** National Forest

Dumping in the Sam Houston National Forest is illegal, as two individuals soon found out when the similarly named Constable Sam Houston discovered them illegally dumping mattresses on Feb. 22.

The Pct. 3 constable for San Jacinto County says he came upon a large Penske rental truck being used by the two individuals in the FM 945 area near Tony Tap Rd.

"They were indeed dumping back there," said Houston.

The materials being dumped include numerous mattresses, box springs and other similar items. Houston called in National Forest Officer Justin Smith to help him with the situation.

'We made them load it up back in their truck and made them leave," said Houston. The two individuals were allegedly contracted by a company called Mattress One, but do not work directly with the business.

Houston says anyone who is caught in the act of illegally dumping can face a fine of \$500. However, catching individuals in the act of illegally

dumping is not as easy as it may sound. "It's hard to prosecute them because you have to catch them in the act,"

Because of this, charges cannot be made against anyone if their materials are found in an area such as the Sam Houston National Forest if no one is

around dumping them. Anyone who sees someone they believe may be committing illegal dumping can help out local law enforcement by taking a picture of the vehicle and the license plate numbers. However, Houston does not encourage confronting anyone that may be committing the act for safety reasons. "You never know what you're dealing with," he said.

Summary: Sugar Legowski Garcia wasn't always fat, but fat is what she is now at age seventeen. Not as fat as her mama, who is so big she hasn't gotten out of bed in months. Not as heavy as her brother, Skunk, who has more meanness in him than fat, which is saying something. But she's large enough to be the object of ridicule wherever she is: at the grocery store, walking down the street, at school Sugar's life is dictated by taking care of Mama in their rundown home—shopping, cooking, and, well, eating. A lot of eating, which Sugar hates as much as she loves.

When Sugar meets Even (not Evan—his nearly illiterate father

misspelled his name on the birth certificate), she has the new experience of someone seeing her and not her body. As their unlikely friendship builds, Sugar allows herself to think about the future for the first time, a future not weighed down by her body or her mother.

Soon Sugar will have to decide to become the girl Even helps her see beyond the mirror or sink into the darkness of the skin-deep role her family and her life have created for her.

My Review Sugar is an extremely emotional and introspective book. It's about a girl who is morbidly obese and finds escape from her life by turning to food and eating. She is bullied constantly. By people making piggy noises in the street, laughing at her or ignoring her at school, and even in her own home. "I hear you've been running around with some boy. There ain't no one that likes you, Sugar. You're too ugly, too fat, and

Maybe it doesn't sound very interesting to you, but Sugar is such a wellcrafted character that her story is deeply upsetting. Her self-loathing is palpable and she quickly becomes a character who matters to the reader. I almost instantly became emotionally invested in Sugar and I wanted her to learn to love herself, to get away from her abusive family and prove the stupid bullies wrong.

The reason I gave this book 3 stars is because after the author sets the scene and grips your heart, a big hunk of the book just seems to be filler. I think the author could've done more with the story line, more to make sure the reader couldn't help but be engaged all the way through.

And though I really liked Even, he seemed a bit too perfect. Too honest, good-looking, smart, kind, accepting, somehow able to see what nobody else could, always ready with the perfect thing to say. I feel as though he would've been a little more realistic if he had had some flaws, too, and though the story hints at an abusive father and tough upbringing, there wasn't enough shown about it to put you in his shoes, and his complexity as a character, compared to Sugar's, was far lacking.

Another reason for my 3 star rating was the ending. I didn't think it had enough justice, enough "good guys win". I wanted something bigger to happen and I wanted to see where life took Sugar down the road. I think if the author added on a nice epilogue it would have rounded this book out nicely. This is a book not just about a person's relationship with food, but also about bullying and being unable to escape from yourself. I'm glad I read it and I feel like this story will always stick with me and won't become one of those books I can't even remember reading.




