GENRE: Dystopia

And though almost every review I read before or since reading this book myself are still 5 stars, I couldn't help but feel...disappointed.

her own, and access to knowledge. But all of that is gone now...

There is a huge difference between an okay book and a great book. An okay book allows you to be a spectator. You are a spectator on the outside watching the story unfold. A great book makes you feel like you are a part of the story. It makes you feel like the story is happening to you.

I was a spectator throughout this entire book. It wasn't a bad story but I was completely let down. It was supposed to be the ultimate dystopian, everyone from everywhere has recommended this book but I just wanted it to be over. Once I realized nothing was ever going to happen I began listening as much and as often as I could...not because I was so completely sucked in, but because I wanted to be done with it.

A book reviewer I follow (that, of course, gave this book a shining review) said that the best dystopian books are the ones that make you feel like it is something that could really happen, and she felt that this book did that. I disagree. Not necessarily because of what happens, but because of the short amount of time it took to happen. I don't feel like such a complete and utter oppression and complete flip of our entire way of life could have happened so quickly that the main character remembers being married and having a child of her own, but yet who is still young enough to be considered attractive and whose ovaries are still viable. What does that say about us if we could be completely oppressed so quickly? Would we give no fight at all? Then again, what do I know? I may cooperate into being completely oppressed too, if I were afraid enough. But having my child ripped away from me? There's no way mother's everywhere wouldn't fight tooth and nail against being forcibly separated from their children, myself included. I thought the world building was great. Maybe there was just too much of it. This book gave me the feeling of sitting in history class. I was reading information that I felt was important but yet I was completely detached.

PARENTAL GUIDANCE: 16-17+ (commonsensemedia.org) Parents need to know that The Handmaid's Tale is a powerful, potentially disturbing dystopian satire set in a future America where women have been stripped of all their civil rights. It features strong language, emotional and physical violence, and a couple of graphic sex scenes. The corpses of dissidents are hung in public as grim reminders of the cost of rebellion. There is mention of handmaids who have committed suicide by hanging. The most violent scene in the novel involves a public ceremony where women are whipped into a frenzy and then allowed to beat an accused person to death.

• Sprinkle the shrimp with 1 tbsp of cajun spice and toss well. Drizzle the flour over the shrimp and toss in a bowl to make sure each shrimp is covered in flour.

- In a deep skillet add the butter and olive oil and heat over high heat. Add shrimp and cook on each side about 2 min until crisp. Remove shrimp from the skillet and set aside.
- In the same skillet add chicken broth and heavy cream. Season with additional cajun spice if preferred and/or salt and pepper. Bring to a boil then add the Parmesan cheese and whisk. Add fettuccine and shrimp back
- to the pot and toss. · Garnish with parsley and additional Parmesan cheese.
