First I would like to thank the Shepherd City Council for their tremendous support and for their dedicated service to the Citizens of Shepherd, The Shepherd Economic Development Corporation (EDC) for their good working relationship with the City, The Pct. 2 Constable Dept. which provides the City's law enforcement because of an interlocal agreement and The City Staff for providing good public service to the Citizens of this City. Special thanks go out to the Citizens of this City for your support, your valuable input and expressing your concerns that our City is addressing today.

I have listened! Now it is time for action. During the night of the swearing in ceremony I stated that I would keep the Citizens informed of what your City is doing. Here is a brief overview. Mrs. Monica Pierre, the assistant area Director from the United States Dept. of Agricultural (USDA) participated in a workshop with the City Council and Economic Development Board members to explain the procedures for obtaining funding for much needed infrastructure for the City. I then had a follow-up meeting with Mrs. Pierre and the Area Director of the USDA, Mrs. Sabrina Glenn, in which we went on a site tour to view the conditions of the City's Infrastructure. From that meeting the USDA in conjunction with the City of Shepherd and the EDC decided to host a Housing Fair. This Housing Fair will be March 31, 2017 with the first of two sessions beginning at 9:00am and lasting until Noon. The second session will be from 1:00pm-4:00pm. The Housing Fair will be at the Shepherd Community Center located at 10251 Hwy 150 here in Shepherd. This is next to the Baseball Fields and across the street from the Shepherd Primary School. The USDA offers funding options for home repairs or to finance the purchase of a new home. The USDA will provide staff to assist with the application process. The Housing Fair is not limited to just citizens of Shepherd but for all

the surrounding areas as well.

Another action that was helpful to the Citizens of Shepherd was that the Council took action to lower the deposit amount required to rent the Shepherd Community Center.

I have been talking and working with DETCOG, with Parks and Wildlife and Congressman Kevin Brady's office seeking grants for the City. The EDC is working with the Office of the Governor's State Economic Development Department to develop a strategic plan for Economic Growth. Betty Russo, long time San Jacinto County resident, who now works in this office, has been a valuable asset and a great source of information.

As part of the Earth Day celebration I will be seeking volunteers, organization and businesses to team up to clean up Shepherd. This will be Phase I and will be called "Beautify Shepherd" with Zero Tolerance for littering. City Ordinances allow for a penalty of up to \$2000.00 for any public health or sanitation violations which include dumping refuse. Finally upon Council approval, I will be working with the San Jacinto County Probation Dept. to have Community Service workers assigned to the City and will be used to keep the City clean as well as other City related projects or duties that will benefit Shepherd. Another item of interested that will be discussed at the next City Council meeting is an emergency notification system which will alert the public of emergencies and City activities.

I spoke with the San Jacinto County Sgt. Todd, that is over the Animal Control Division and he assured me that when you need them they will be available.

BEST WAY TO COOK BEEF SHOULDER ROAST

A key point to remember when cooking shoulder roast is that it contains a lot of connective tissue, which can benefit from slow cooking at a low temperature. It's a delicious meal, but needs to be cared for tenderly. This beef cut should be cooked with liquid to prevent it from being tough and stringy. Three cooking options are available which include stove top simmering, crock pot cooking and oven roasting. Regardless of which method

you choose, the result will be a savory dish to feature in a family dinner. Inaredients:

- 3 to 4 pound beef shoulder roast (on sale \$2.99lb!)
- 1 onion (vellow onions on sale 3lbs/\$0.99!) • salt, pepper and other seasonings of your choice
- chopped potatoes and carrots (11b. baby carrots on sale \$0.99!)
- cooking oil
- several cloves of garlic
- 1/2 cup to 1 cup water or beef broth

STOVE TOP METHOD

- · Add a little cooking oil to a dutch oven and preheat to medium temperature. Sprinkle salt on the meat and place it in the hot pot. Brown on all sides.
- Add a sliced onion and several peeled garlic cloves to the pot and stir. For a 3 to 4 lb. roast, add 1 cup liquid. The liquid may be beef broth, water or apple cider. For extra flavor, add seasonings and spices such as thyme, pepper and bay leaf.
- Bring the liquid to a boil, then cover the pot and reduce the heat to low. Turn the meat to the other side every half hour. Cook for 1 hour and 45 minutes.
- Add chopped vegetables such as potatoes, carrots and turnips and cook an additional 30 to 45 minutes.

OVEN ROASTING

- Add a little cooking oil to a dutch oven and preheat to medium temperature. Sprinkle salt on the meat and place it in the hot pot. Brown on all sides. • Add a sliced onion and several peeled garlic cloves to the pot and stir.
- For a 3 to 4 lb. roast, add 1 cup liquid. The liquid may be beef broth, water or apple cider. For extra flavor you can add seasonings and spices such as thyme, pepper and bay leaf.
- Add chopped potatoes and carrots. Put the pot into an oven that has been preheated to 350 degrees. Cook 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 hours.

TIPS

• You may substitute red wine for the liquid ingredient, or use a packet of onion soup mix in place of the onion. Some cooks like to add mushrooms or cream of mushroom soup. Different herbs can add an interesting flavor, such as marjoram and oregano. Then enjoy!

Make it a Meal! This meal comes with most everything you need but I would serve it with some warm yummy yeast rolls to make it perfect. My personal favorite are Rhodes frozen dinner rolls! Recipe found at www.leaf.tv


