RANCH POTATOES

Ingredients:

- 8-10 medium potatoes (cut into 1/2" cubes) (5lb bag russet potatoes on sale 2/\$3.00!)
- 1 can cream of mushroom soup
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 1 envelope ranch salad dressing mix
- 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese (divided)
- 6baconslices (cooked until crispy and crumbled) (Bar-Sbacon 12oz. on sale \$2.99!)
- salt & pepper

Directions:

- Pre-heat the oven to 350 degrees. Add potatoes to a large pot. Add enough water to cover the potatoes and bring to a boil over high heat. Cook for 10-12 minutes or until the potatoes are almost tender. Drain.
- Lightly grease an 9X13 casserole dish. In a bowl mix together cream of mushroom soup, milk, ranch dressing, 1 cup of the cheese, salt and pepper. Pour over potatoes in the casserole dish.
- Sprinkle remaining cup of shredded cheddar cheese and the crumbled bacon over the top. Place into the oven and bake uncovered for 25-30 minutes or until the potatoes are tender.

A History Making Year for Shepherd High School Band



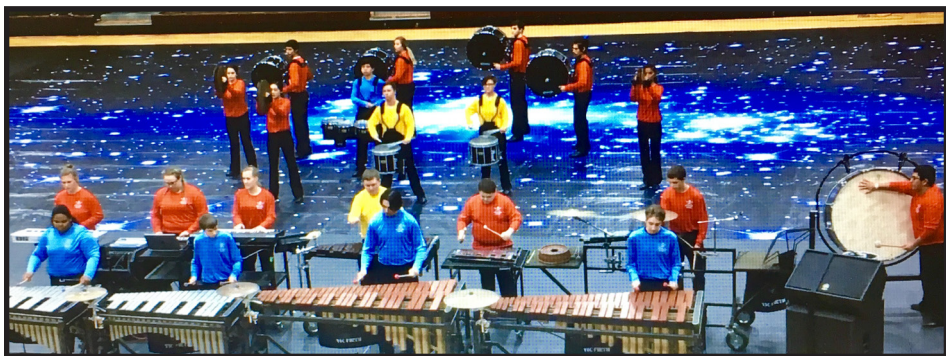
The Shepherd HS Royal Blue Band program is having a banner year in 2016-2017. School history was made with the success of the marching band in U.I.L. competition. After a 1st division at the Regional level, the band advanced all the way to 4A Area Finals last October, no other Shepherd band has ever advanced that far. Then again history was made at the U.I.L. regional solo and ensemble contest in February. There were 17 - 1st division solos and ensembles represented by 28 different students at the regional level. That translated to a record number of students advancing to the State U.I.L. Solo and Ensemble Contest to be held this May in Austin. The band has 10 events advancing, represented by 24 different students.

This spring semester finds the program competing in both the Indoor Winter Guard and the Indoor Drum Line competitions. Both of these groups compete in the Texas Color Guard Circuit (TCGC), which is not school size based, but talent based, so Shepherd is quite often competing against the 5A and 6A high schools as one of the smallest groups there, being only 4A ourselves. The Shepherd High Indoor Percussion (SHIP) is in its fifth year of competition and has won a divisional state medal each of the previous four years. The SHIP most recently placed 2nd in their division in local competition at Tomball Memorial HS on March 25.

The guard has won state silver the previous two years and were on track for another successful state run in their division, when the promotion came, which is a victory within itself. The guard's TCGC state contest is in College Station on April 1st and the percussion's TCGC state contest is in College Station on April 8th.



The full H.S. band is currently in the middle of their U.I.L. Concert and Sight-Reading preparation with contest coming up on April 7th at Caney Creek H.S. In this competition, the H.S. band has received 1st division ratings in concert, two of the last five years, and 1st division ratings in sight-reading, six of the last eight years. With the potential success of the band at the Concert and Sight-Reading contest, The Royal Blue Band could be looking at the U.I.L. Sweepstakes Award, which would again make school history. So, congratulations to these fine students of Shepherd High School, the performing organizations and their instructors for a superior year of success and best wishes for continued progress and success in the future.
