Eighteen local units from throughout TRTA's Sixth District sent their new officers to receive training for their respective offices and chairmen. The retirees also learned more about the interim hearings being held by the TRS-Care Joint Legislative Committee. The retiree's state health care will be running out of funds sometime during the next legislative session. Members also heard about the progress being made in Washington D.C. on the Windfall Eliimination Provision Bill (HR 711) sponsored by Texas Congressman Kevin Brady.

Training sessions helped new officers understand their duties, find resources and how to carry out the many important TRTA programs. District officers who had been trained at the state level provided the district level training. Special guest at the District meeting was TRTA State Treasurer, Leroy DeHaven.

Sam Houston EC Members to **Elect Board of Directors**

Sam Houston Electric Cooperative members can look for their Board of Director election ballot in the mail this month. Members will once again have the option to vote online.

All Sam Houston EC members will still receive a paper ballot as well, so they can mail in their ballot if they prefer. The election opened May 16, and members who have their email address listed on their Sam Houston EC account will receive an email giving instructions on how to vote online. Members can also follow the online voting instructions that will accompany the ballot that will be mailed. Both electronic (online) and mail-in votes will be eligible for the prize drawings at the 2016 Annual Meeting of Members next month.

Ballots must be received, either online or by mail, no later than 10 a.m., Monday, June 13, 2016.

Members who complete their ballot by the early bird deadline of June 7, 2016, will be eligible for a grand prize drawing that will take place at the Co-op's Annual Meeting of Members on June 14, 2016. Prizes include an electric golf cart, a \$2,000 bill credit, a HD television and an Apple iWatch. Members do not need to be present at the Annual Meeting to win the early voting prizes.

To elect the Board of Directors, a quorum of at least 10 percent of the membership is required. To ensure equal representation of more than 54,000 Sam Houston EC members living in 10 counties, the Cooperative's service territory is divided into five districts. Collectively, there are 11 Board members, each living in the district that they serve.

The Cooperative Elections Committee met on March 8, 2016, and reviewed all candidates for election. Two incumbents running for reelection were placed on the ballot. The committee received no petitions for election from the membership.

District 5, serving Montgomery and Walker Counties, has two Directors up for re-election. The candidates recommended by the Elections Committee are W.E. "Ernie" Miles and Thomas Lucher, both from District 5.

"As a member-owner, you are an important part of the decision-making and policy setting at the Co-op," Sam Houston EC general manager and CEO $Kyle\ J.\ Kuntz\ wrote\ in\ a\ letter\ published\ in\ the\ ballot\ booklet\ sent\ to\ members.$ "That means you have the right to vote annually for your Board of Directors."

Sam Houston EC members are encouraged to mark their calendars for the Annual Meeting of Members taking place on Tuesday, June 14, 2016. The meeting will once again be held at the Polk County Commerce Center in Livingston. There is plenty of parking close to the Commerce Center, which is located at 1017 North 59 Loop in Livingston (entrance at Pedigo Park). Shuttles will be available from the parking area to the facility.

Registration will begin at 12 p.m. and the meeting will commence at 1:30 p.m. Snacks and entertainment will be provided. Door prizes including home electronics, power tools, electric bill credits, and gift cards from area retailers will be given away. Cooperative managers will also report on Co-op business, including the announcement of the Board of Director election results.

Sam Houston EC received its charter May 16, 1939, and has been providing electricity to East Texas ever since. The Cooperative was founded by a handful of farmers and rural residents who dreamed of bringing "power to the people."

In the early 1940s, there were just over 600 Co-op members. Today. Sam Houston EC serves 54,000 members and more than 71,000 meters across parts of 10 counties.

Here is a cautionary tale. This happened to me today. The phone rang and a robo-call told me to call a number to talk to the IRS about 'legal issues facing me'. I know the IRS do not phone people about these issues and I am not expecting problems with them, but I thought I would see what 'they' said. A very foreign voice on a poor phone line told me I owed \$11,000 dating back over 12 years and would have my driver's licence confiscated, be taken to court and other unpleasant things would happen if I didn't make a payment at once. It sounded like he could be in a different country. I told the man I knew it was a scam and hung up but I want others to know that some people may be taken in by this intimidating behavior. I believe they target older people who are often more vulnerable. If you have parents or grandparents who may become a target, please make sure they know about this. The IRS say they never call on the phone in this way, and instead send notices by mail. I called our Sheriff's department and let them know this was happening in our area.

On a more pleasant note, preparations for Shepherd July 4th Celebration is moving ahead smoothly. Our Board Secretary, Helenmarie Johnson, says we have more vendors and the Firework-Laser display will be spectacular. Call the chamber number if you want to be a vendor.
