We Need Your Help

The Texas Legislature is working on bills that eliminate cash payments for metal at all scrap yards in Texas. The proposed method is a check mailed to the seller at the address on their ID. They also limit the seller to one transaction per day. If passed, these bills will become effective September 1, 2015.

This will affect all of our customers who make a living by recycling. Please call your State Representative and Senator with your name and address and request that they not support these bills! They include Senate Bill 437, Senate Bill 513 and House Bill 876.

Primary School Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten Registration

Shepherd Primary School will have Prekindergarten and Kindergarten registration the week of May 11-15, 2015; 9:00-11:00 & 1:00-2:30 Registration will be for children who will be 4 years old (Prekindergarten) and 5 years old (Kindergarten) before September 1, 2015.

NOTE: If your child is already attending Prekindergarten, you do not need to register again.

For Pre-Kindergarten Students only: In order to attend our P-K program you must meet one the following requirements:

(1) Qualify for School Lunch Program with Proof of Income, (Food Stamp Letter or 2 most recent check stubs, or if self employed, we will need ledger books, and/or self-issued checks or last year’s tax return, or letter from employers concerning cash income.)

(2) Show proof that parent is an active employee of Shepherd I.S.D.

(3) Parent is an active member of the United States Armed Forces, (must show military I.D.), or parent was injured or killed during active duty.

(4) Proof that child has ever been in the conservatorship (foster care) of the Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS) following an adversary hearing.

(5) Be unable to speak and comprehend the English Language.

(6) Homeless, Student Residency Questionnaire form must be completed by parent.

(7) Tuition paid at the Shepherd I.S.D. Administration building, in the amount of \$2,000.00, due before enrollment.

For Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten Students: In order to register you will need to bring the following information on your child: Certified Birth Certificate, Social Security Card, Shot Records, Proof of Residence (i.e. utility bill), and your Driver’s License. (Immunization Requirements are per State of Texas Guidelines. Requirements are subject to change by state mandate.)

Para Pre-Kindergarten Los estudiantes sólo: Para poder asistir a nuestro programa PK debe cumplir con uno de los siguientes requisitos:

(1) Calificar Programa de Almuerzo Escolar para la Prueba de ingresos, (Carta de beneficios de Alimentos o 2 más recientes talones de cheques, o si trabaja por cuenta propia, necesitaremos libros de contabilidad y / o cheques auto expedidos o declaración de impuestos del año pasado, o carta de los empleadores en relación con los ingresos en efectivo.)

(2) Mostrar prueba de que el padre es un empleado activo de Shepherd ISD

(3) Un padre es un miembro activo de las Fuerzas Armadas de los Estados Unidos, (debe mostrar una identificación militar), o padre resultó herido o muerto durante el servicio activo.

(4) La prueba de que niño ha estado siempre bajo la tutela (hogares de guarda) del Departamento de Familia y Servicios de Protección (DFPS) después de una audiencia adversa.

(5) Ser incapaz de hablar y comprender el idioma Inglés.

(6) Sin hogar, un Cuestionario de Residencia del Estudiante debe ser completado por el padre.

(7) La matrícula pagada en el Edificio de la administración de Shepherd ISD, en la cantidad de \$ 2,000.00, debido antes de la inscripción.

Para Pre-Kínder y Kínder estudiantes: Para registrarse tendrá que traer la siguiente información sobre su hijo: Acta de Nacimiento, Tarjeta de Seguro Social, registros de vacunas, Comprobante de residencia, (por ejemplo: recibo de servicios públicos), y su licencia de conducir. (Requisitos de inmunización son por Estado de las Directrices de Texas. Los requisitos son sujetos a cambios por mandato del estado.)
