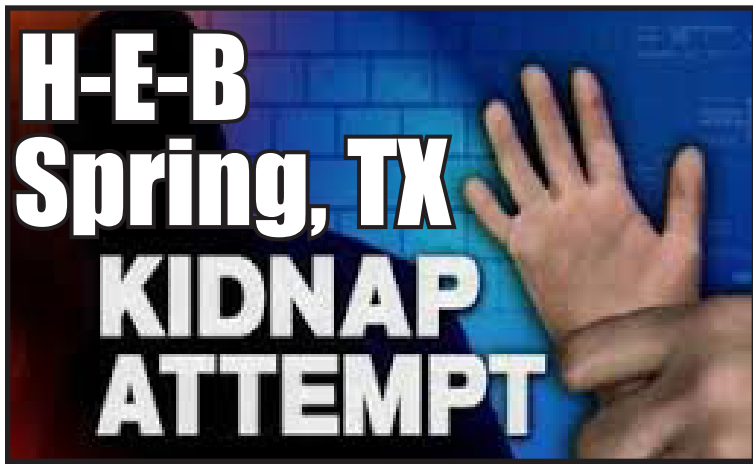
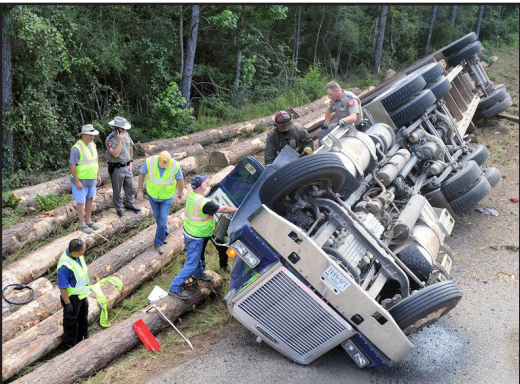

18-Wheeler Turns Over on FM-943, Volunteer Firemen Spend Nearly 2 Hours in Rescue of Passenger



July 6, 2016 - At approximately 8:30 am on July 6, 2016, an 18-wheeler logging truck, driven by Alan Dwight Johnson, 32, of Livingston, was west-bound on FM-943 (a few miles from 146). Johnson apparently entered and came out of a curve too fast. His passenger’s side tires left the pavement to the right. When Johnson tried to correct, the pavement (slightly elevated) forced his loaded 18-wheeler to leave the pavement further. This caused his load to shift and the rig turned over losing its load of large pine trees. Americare Ambulance Service was dispatched to the scene along with the Segno and Livingston Volunteer Fire Departments, Deputy Rey Davalos with the Polk County Sheriff’s Office and Troopers Nick Hatton, Corporal Ramey Bass, and Sergeant Sam Lattner with the Texas Highway Patrol. Johnson was pulled from the wreckage and loaded onto an ambulance. His passenger, Zulma Santiago, 26, of Livingston was unable to come out as her left leg was severely pinned in the wreckage. Firemen used the Jaws-of-Life to get the door open and get inside with Santiago. Jake Dominy with the Livingston Fire Department crawled into the turned over 18 wheeler to help the passenger who was severely pinned inside. Once inside the firemen had to remove one of the seats to get Santiago. Due to the severity of the entrapment, it took nearly two hours to free Santiago. Amazingly, she had no major injuries. Both were transported by ambulance to CHI Livingston Memorial Hospital. All traffic on 943 was blocked during investigation and the lengthy cleanup. Alan Johnson was cited for failure to maintain a single lane of traffic. A heavy-duty wrecker from Riley Wrecker Service out of Corrigan cleaned up the mess.

In a report first posted on the Rayford Road Round Up Spring, Texas Facebook page, 3 men allegedly attempted to kidnap a toddler at the Spring Creek Market H-E-B around 9:30 a.m. on Thursday morning.

The report by the mother of the toddler read:

“PSA please be very careful and alert out and about with your children. I just had a very terrifying experience at the new HEB. Three men were profiling my toddler and one man attempted to get close enough to take her. I was extremely lucky to grab her in enough time and secure her in the cart and find management. She was pushing one of the kid carts when three men surrounded us and slowly worked their way closer and closer. Their behavior was extremely suspicious. They continued to follow me through the store as I hustled to find help. They stayed fanned out and continued to follow me until I made a break for the front of the store where I found the manager. They did not have a cart and did not grab any items from meat all the way to the turn by bottled water/household items. They stayed in the store wandering up and down aisles. Separately, then meeting before separating again. They were approached by the manager and then at that time they grabbed a few items and paid. I refused to leave until I knew police were called. My focus was on getting my children safely to my car where I could lock it and wait for them to leave. I was escorted out of the building when I was told they left. Multiple HEB employees stood outside and I was escorted to my car. We then saw one of the men come around from one exit and the others all meet at their car. They had not left, just scattered. The manager approached the car as I secured my kids in their seats and we contacted the police. The manager got the license plate and police are currently looking for the car. Please no negative comments. I am terrified. I am already asking what could I have done better, what shouldn't I have done. I am grateful God was watching over us and protected us and alerted me in that moment. I have so much more to say, but between shaking and needing to tend to my kids this is the short story of what happened. Just please be alert.”

The suspects were described as 3 heavier set Hispanic males in their 30s-40s in long sleeve plaid or flannel t-shirt shirts and jeans. They drove away in an older model Silver Grand AM with the license plate number GWJ-4877.

5 Great Reasons to Quit Smoking



1. You'll Live Longer if You Quit Smoking

To quit smoking is to literally gain a new lease on life. "There's no single thing you can do to your body on a regular basis that's as negative as smoking," says Thomas Glynn, PhD, director of cancer science and trends and international cancer control for the American Cancer Society. "The Surgeon General said it causes damage to nearly every organ in your body." About half of all smokers who continue with their habit will die of a smoking-related disease, according to the American Cancer Society. Cancer is the biggie, of course; smoking is linked to 15 forms of cancer. Then there's lung disease, heart disease, and other smoking-related illnesses. Male smokers lose an average of 13.2 years of life due to smoking, while female smokers lose an average of 14.5 years of life. Don't fall for the old dodge that it's too late to quit smoking because “the damage is already done.” "There's a lot of data to suggest that quitting at any age is positive for your health," Glynn says. People who quit smoking at age 50 cut their odds of dying during the next 15 years in half.

2. You'll Be Protecting Family and Friends if You Quit Smoking

Smokers aren't just taking themselves down. They're also harming everyone exposed to their smoke. Says Glynn, "Secondhand smoke kills about 50,000 people a year and sickens many more, particularly children." In fact, a recent study found that pregnant women who live or work with smokers had a higher risk of stillbirth than those who weren't in close contact with smokers, suggesting that exposure to tobacco smoke can harm even unborn babies. Experts speculate that the chemicals in cigarettes may harm the fetus by restricting blood flow and possibly damaging the placenta. Secondhand smoke contains all the same carcinogens found in the smoke that's been inhaled into your lungs. Infants and children in smokers' homes suffer more colds, bronchitis, ear infections, and other lung and breathing problems than kids in smoke-free homes.

3. Your Body Can Start to Repair Itself When You Quit Smoking

Your body starts repairing itself within hours after that last cigarette. "You start getting your strength back within a week to 10 days after you quit," Glynn says. "You also get back your sense of smell and taste." Your heart rate and blood pressure drops almost immediately, and within weeks your circulation and ability to breathe improve dramatically. You'll also look better. Smoking prematurely ages the skin, causing wrinkles. Smoking stains your teeth, fingers, and fingernails, and causes bad breath.

4. People Will Like You More if You Quit Smoking

Smoking is much less socially acceptable these days. Nearly all workplaces ban smoking from buildings. Some landlords don't rent to smokers, due to higher maintenance costs and more expensive insurance rates. Most public events are now smoke-free, and more states and communities are enacting laws to ban smoking from all indoor public places, including bars and restaurants.

A survey of current and former New York City smokers found that 81 percent agreed that most folks wouldn't hire a smoker to care for their children, 72 percent thought non-smokers would be reluctant to date a smoker, and 39 percent believe most people think less of smokers.

5. You'll Be Saving Money

Smoking is a very expensive habit. "The average smoker spends about \$2,200 a year on tobacco use," Glynn says. Just add up all the money you're spending on a day's worth of smokes, then multiply that by 365. Don't forget to figure in higher health and life insurance rates, as well as higher health care costs down the line when your habit catches up with you. One Pot Cabbage Casserole

Ingredients

- 2lbs ground beef (**Family Pack Fresh Ground Beef \$3.29lb!**)
- salt & pepper or creole seasoning
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 cup rice, uncooked (**Riceland LG Rice 16oz 3/\$2.00!**)
- 3 large handfuls of roughly chopped cabbage
- 1 8 oz. can tomato sauce (**Parade Tomato Sauce 8oz on sale 4/\$1.00!**)
- 2 cups of water (I just use the tomato sauce can twice)
- 1 14 oz. can diced tomatoes, undrained
- 1 cup shredded cheese (I used Colby Jack) (**Crystal Farms shredded cheese 8oz 2/\$4.00!**)

Directions:

- Seas on and brown ground beef and onions. Drain off grease.
- Once onions are clear, add rice, cabbage, tomato sauce, 2 cups of water (or use tomato sauce cans) and diced tomatoes. Stir.
- Let it come to a boil and then reduce heat to medium low and cover to simmer for about 20 to 30 minutes or until rice is done and cabbage is soft. Do not lift lid before 20 minutes to make sure rice cooks well.
- Once cooked, top with cheese and cover with lid to melt a few minutes.

Tom “Bear” Wilson

San Jacinto County honored a resident and hero of the Vietnam War at a memorial service for Lt. Col. Tom “Bear” Wilson on Friday, July 8, 2016. The service was held at 12:00 noon at the courthouse, 1 State Highway 150, Coldspring, TX 77331. Southeast Texas Patriot Guard Riders, American Legion Harold G. Davis Post 629 Riders and other Riders escorted Lt. Col. Wilson’s widow, Becky Wilson, and his ashes from their home in Cape Royal to the service. Lt. Col. Wilson retired from the United States Air Force after serving 24 years. He was a long time Electronic Warfare Officer (EWO) in F-105 and F-4 “Wild Weasels”, with over 3000 hours of flying time, mostly in fighters. During his 500 hours of combat flying, he earned four Silver Star Medals for gallantry and three Distinguished Flying Crosses for heroism. He also served in various roles as instructor, flight examiner, tactician, staff officer, and unit commander. Lt. Col. Wilson authored three highly acclaimed fictional novels of events during the Vietnam War. His first novel, "Termite Hill" is mandatory reading for the Top Guns Pilots. It is also one of the top ten books recommended by the Air Force Historian. He went on to write six more fictional works and numerous articles for military magazines. His works include; Lucky's Bridge 1993; Tango Uniform 1994; Black Wolf 1995; Final Thunder 1996; Desert Fury 1998; Black Sky 2003 and Black Serpent 2005. His ashes will be buried in Arlington National Cemetery July 13, 2016 at 2:00 p.m.
