“The Polk County Sheriff’s Office is looking for Joseph C. Roy and Stacy Pharris Tullos Roy. 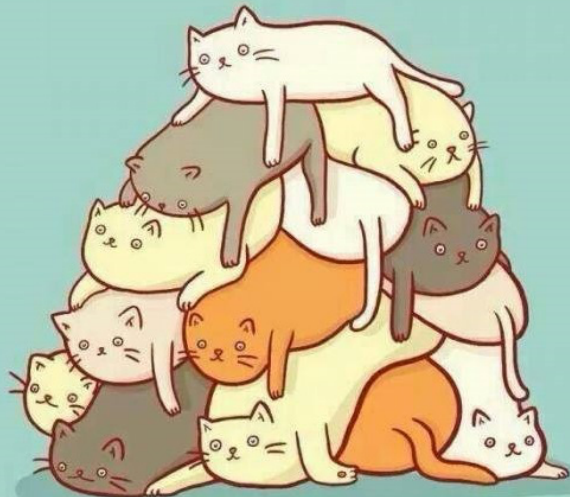

Ooey Gooley Cake Mix Bars

Ingredients

Crust:

- 1 box yellow cake mix, dry—not prepared
- (Betty Crocker on sale \$0.99!)*
- 8 tablespoons butter, melted

• 1 egg

Gooley Layer:

- 8 oz. cream cheese, softened
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 16 oz. powdered sugar

Directions

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
- In a medium bowl, combine cake mix, melted butter and egg. Mix until smooth and well combined.
- Pat and press dough evenly over the bottom of a greased 9x13 baking pan. Set aside.
- In a separate large bowl, beat and cream the cream cheese. Add the eggs and beat until smooth for a minute or two. Add powdered sugar and continue to beat until well combined.
- Pour over crust and bake at 350 degrees F for about 25-30 minutes or until done. Do not over bake.
- When done, remove from oven and let cool completely before cutting into. *Recipe from Paula Deen*

littie's Book Shelf

Wool
by Hugh Howey
509 pages

Genre: Young Adult/Dystopian

Summary: This is the story of mankind clawing for survival, of mankind on the edge. The world outside has grown unkind, the view of it limited, talk of it forbidden. But there are always those who hope, who dream. These are the dangerous people, the residents who infect others with their optimism. Their punishment is simple. They are given the very thing they profess to want: They are allowed outside.

What would you do if the world outside was deadly, and the air you breathed could kill? And you lived in a place where every birth required a death, and the choices you made could save lives—or destroy them.

My Review: This book has seen a lot of hype in the kindle self-publishing world. It started out as a 49 page stand-alone novella, but when readers clamored for more, Hugh Howey followed up with four subsequent volumes. Afterwards, it was picked up and published into the 509 page novel that you see here. The story is good. It really is. But I don't think it really needed over 500 pages to tell it. The world building is good, the characters are even better, but it does drag out quite a bit and I found myself getting pretty bored with the long passages about trudging up and down the levels of the silo. I got it, they're long. They're tiresome. I personally would rather die than ascend or descend them in any way, shape, or form. But do we really need to hear about the whole process every time a character does it? Probably not. And I think some fine-tune editing would have made the story much better. Not that Hugh Howey cares at all what I think. Sigh.

One thing I did enjoy about this book was that it never, not once, went into the direction I thought it would. On several occasions I thought I had the story line figured out, or at least a hunch at where it would lead, only to be completely and utterly mistaken every single time. I don't know if I've ever read a book that proved me wrong as many times as this one did. It was different, to say the least.

I loved Juliet. She is a very strong, smart, butt-kicking female protagonist. She pretty much makes the entire book, even though it takes her a little while to enter the scene.

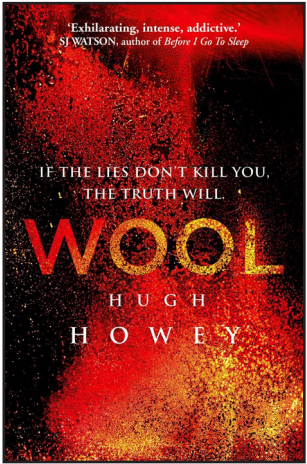
All in all this was a suspenseful and interesting book with good characters and impressive world building. I'd definitely recommend it to any and all dystopian fans.

Parental Guidance: 13-14 and up. There is a bit of foul language in the book, as well as quite a bit of violence and people put to "Cleaning" (sent outside to their deaths). No too-descriptive intimate scenes and only very light innuendos.

Stand Alone or Series: Wool is the first novel in the Silo series, it is followed by Shift and the final novel is titled Dust.
