## State Board of Education Seeks Public Input Regarding Assessments and Accountability

The State Board of Education (SBOE) is issuing a survey in English and Spanish to seek public input about the state’s current assessment and accountability programs and gather suggestions for future program development. The survey will be open online to all Texans through **June 30**. From **October 2015 to March 2016**, SBOE members held nine Community Conversations meetings around the state, meeting with more than 500 citizens to gather comments about the state’s student assessment and accountability systems. The online survey addresses the issues raised during the community meetings and allows for additional input from educators, parents, business people and students. "Our constituents often talk to board members about testing and school ratings issues," said SBOE Chair Donna Bahorich. "I felt it was also important for board members to have in-depth discussions to learn what educators, parents, business people and others want from these two high profile programs. I believe our findings will be useful in shaping the next generation systems."

The information gathered from the survey and the Community Conversations will be compiled into a report and presented to the SBOE for its consideration at its **July 19-22** meeting. Once adopted, the report will be provided to legislative leaders and the Texas Commission on Next Generation Assessments and Accountability.

The 15-member commission, created by the Texas Legislature, is to make recommendations for statutory changes to the state’s assessment and accountability systems. The commission report is to be submitted to the governor and legislature by **Sept. 1**.

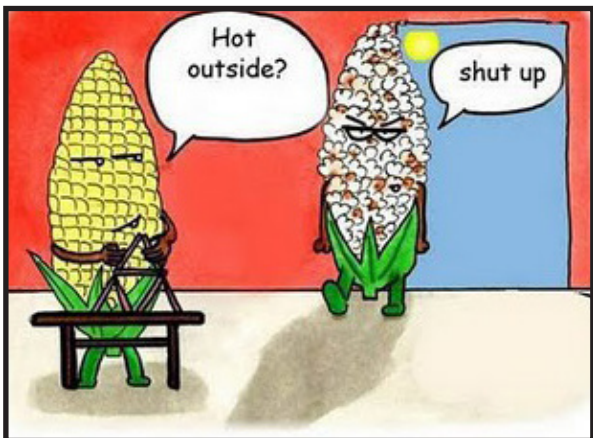

## East Texas Football Legend to Retire from Electric Cooperative



Edd Hargett, General Manager of East Texas Electric Cooperative since 2005, plans to retire from the cooperative on June 30th. Honored June 24th at a special ceremony during ETEC's annual membership meeting in Nacogdoches, Hargett thanked his co-workers and family for their support during his years leading the regional electric cooperative. In attendance at the recognition ceremony were Hargett's wife, Shirley, his two sons and daughter, and numerous other family members, with a total attendance of about 130 guests. During the ceremony, several letters of congratulations were presented, from R.C. Slocum, former head coach at Texas A&M; Gene Stallings, also a former head coach at A&M; John Sharp, Chancellor of the Texas A&M University System; Bill Youngkin, from the Association of Former Students at A&M, a personal note from former Governor Rick Perry; and a proclamation signed by Texas Governor Greg Abbott. Slocum, in his letter, stated about Hargett: "Regardless of where you are, or whatever you are involved in, you make things better." Also during the ceremony, Hargett was presented with a maroon golf bag emblazoned with A&M symbols. Hargett and his wife, Shirley, will retire to College Station, where he plans to play golf, enjoy time with their grandchildren and a more relaxed life-style after leaving the electric cooperative. A proud graduate of Texas A&M University with a degree in electrical engineering, Hargett led the Aggies to one of the more unusual Southwest conference championships on record as quarterback of Texas A&M's 1967 football team. Following his successful collegiate football career, he went on to play professional football for the New Orleans Saints, the Houston Oilers and the World Football League. Prior to becoming General Manager of ETEC, Hargett served as general manager of Houston County Electric Cooperative. A native of East Texas, Hargett was born in Marietta and graduated from high school at Linden in Cass County. During his tenure as General Manager at ETEC, Hargett was responsible for overseeing all ETEC power supply agreements, both long and short-term, with various entities. Hargett's leadership on several ETEC projects has led to the successful addition of new power sources totaling 598 MW for the cooperative. "It has been an honor and a privilege to serve as General Manager of ETEC, and I am going to miss working with the entire ETEC team of dedicated board members and employees, along with our consultants and attorneys," said Hargett. He continued, "I am confident that our new General Manager, Ryan Thomas, and ETEC staff will continue to provide exemplary service for our members across East Texas."

We would like to invite everyone to join East Texas Seed Exchange located on facebook. It is a local seed exchange.

The mission is: Sharing, Caring, Growing, Giving.

The intent of EastTexas Seed Exchange group is to be able to share seeds while preserving and sharing seeds as well as heirloom seeds for generations to come. With the rising cost of foods/vegetables it is evermore important for generations to come to learn the importance of being able to grow food to provide for their families. Educating generations on the importance of growing, gardening, saving, providing as well as being frugal.

Seeds are collected, dried and cleaned, often with the same traditional methods as their original owners used- sifting the seeds through screens, drying and storing them in canning jars. Growing seeds that are known producers have withstood the test of time. Most heirloom seeds are known for their taste.

Starting in July we will start taking donations of seeds. I will be posting a form on facebook that needs to be completed with as much information as possible when you donate or exchange. We will have a drop box to be able to drop them in. At which time they will be filed under their common name. Twice a month we will post dates for anyone wanting to stop by and exchange seeds. You will be able to drop the seeds at anytime at the following location, but twice a month we will have a exchange date and time. The drop location address is **5055 FM 222 Coldspring, Texas 77331**. You can also mail seeds to that address. I have already had a big response from various people who are very excited and interested. ## Buy \$mart, Eat Well

### Easy Chicken & Sausage Gumbo

#### Ingredients

- 1/3 cup olive oil
- 1/3 cup flour
- 2-4 chicken breasts, cubed (*FP bone-in chicken breasts on sale \$1.29lb!*)
- 1-2 sausages, sliced (*Kountry Boy sausage 12oz on sale 2/\$5.00!*)
- 1 large chopped onion
- 1 large green bell pepper
- 1 can Rotel tomatoes
- 4 cups chicken broth
- 2 bay leaves
- 4+ cups water to taste/preference
- salt, pepper to taste/preference
- cooked rice

#### Directions

- In a large pot sauté the chicken and sausage together, once cooked pull out and put aside (leaving the drippings).
  - Add the oil and flour and cook over medium high, stirring constantly, until it's the color of a copper penny (this is your roux).
  - Add the onion and green pepper and cook until the vegetables are tender, about 10 mins.
  - Add the chicken, sausage, Rotel, broth, bay leaves, water and salt and pepper and bring mixture to a simmer with the lid on.
  - Turn the heat to low and continue to simmer for a minimum of 20 mins, but the longer you simmer the better the flavor.
  - Keep the lid on for long term cooking, if you take the lid off too often you might need to add more water.
  - Serve over rice (don't serve the bay leaves).
- Make it a Meal! Serve with crusty french bread to complete this delicious, belly-warming meal!

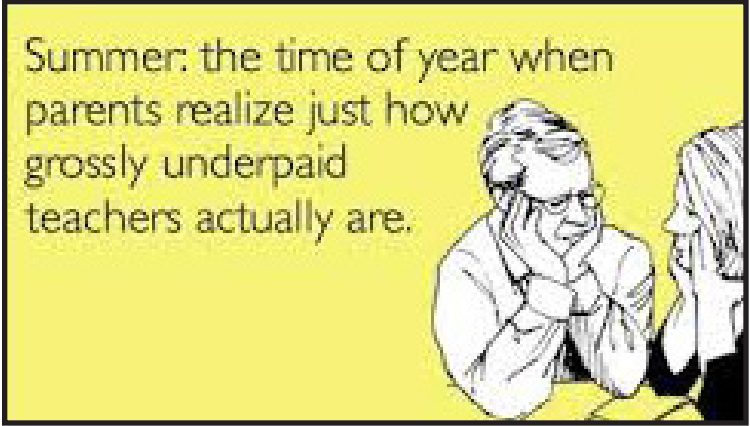
