


11771e'S BOOK Shelf

The Rithmatist

by Brandon Sanderson 353 pages

Genre: Young Adult/Fantasy

Summary: More than anything, Joel wants to be a Rithmatist. Rithmatists have the power to infuse life into two-dimensional figures known as Chalklings. Rithmatists are humanity's only defense against the Wild Chalklings. Having nearly overrun the territory of Nebrask, the Wild Chalklings now threaten all of the American Isles. As the son of a lowly chalkmaker at Armedius



Academy, Joel can only watch as Rithmatist students learn the magical art that he would do anything to practice. Then students start disappearingkidnapped from their rooms at night, leaving trails of blood. Assigned to help the professor who is investigating the crimes, Joel and his friend Melody find themselves on the trail of an unexpected discovery—one that will change Rithmatics—and their world—forever.

My Review: I enjoyed this book, though not as much as Steelheart. There's a magic system, as there always is in Brandon Sanderson's novels, but it was, for lack of a better word, a little boring. There are Wild Chalkings that Rithmatists must learn how draw defensive lines and chalklings that come to life to protect people against the wild ones. I mean, he does as good of a job as it was possible to do to make Wild Chalklings scary but still it's, you know, chalk drawings. I just had a hard time being afraid of chalk, but maybe that's okay because I'm not technically the target audience since this one seems to be geared toward a younger audience than most of Sanderson's novels.

I really liked all the characters, particularly Professor Fitch and Melody, although the main character, Joel, was good, too. My favorite part was the very last fight scene of the book, which going my blood burning with pride. Alas, I'm still undecided if I'll be picking up the second book or not. And since it's expected publication isn't until 2017...yeah. It doesn't bode well for Joel, Melody, and Professor Fitch.

Parental Guidance: 12-17 years (BN.com). No profanity and no intimacy. Some violence and violent descriptions of chalklings, but not too bad. **Stand Alone or Series:** The second book in the series will be titled The Aztlanian and is loosely scheduled for a 2017 release.

Steak & Gravy with Onion

Ingredients

- 3 tablespoons of cooking oil (Parade
- gallon veg oil on sale \$4.99!) • 1 onion, sliced (about 3 cups)
- 1 clove of garlic, minced
- 3 pounds beef bottom round steak (on sale \$4.29lb!)
- Kosher salt and freshly cracked black pepper, to taste
- 1/2 cup of all purpose flour • About 1/4 cup of water for deglazing
- 1 can cream of mushroom soup • 1 soup can of water
- 1/4 teaspoon of dried thyme, crushed

• 1 teaspoon of Kitchen Bouquet **Directions**

• Heat 1 tablespoon of the oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Add the onion and cook, stirring occasionally, until the onions have caramelized, about 12 to 15 minutes. Add the garlic and cook for about a minute. Remove onion and garlic from pan and set aside.

· Meanwhile, season the meat lightly on both sides with salt and pepper and pound with a meat mallet to tenderize. Cut into 6 to 8 serving sized pieces, and dredge in the flour, shaking off any excess. Heat another tablespoon of oil in the same skillet you cooked the onion in over medium heat, and brown the steak on both sides in batches, setting the pieces aside as you brown them and adding additional oil as needed.

• Deglaze the pan by adding in about 1/4 cup of water to the empty skillet, simmering and scraping up all of the browned bits from the bottom of the skillet. Meanwhile combine the cream of mushroom soup, water, thyme and Kitchen Bouquet in a small bowl. Add half of the soup mixture to the pan juices and stir until blended. Return the meat to the skillet, turning to coat each piece and top with the caramelized onions. Pour the remaining soup mix over the top, cover, reduce heat and low simmer, stirring and

turning occasionally, about 1-1/2 to 2 hours, or until meat is very tender. • Transfer meat to a platter or on individual plates and pour the gravy over the meat. 
