In this 16 minute DVD, parents and speech-language experts talk about how to promote easier talking as they interact with their children. The professionals offer simple tips that parents can follow easily.

The DVD features some of the world's leading therapists with children who stutter: Lisa A Scott, Ph.D. of the Florida State University's School of Communication Science and Disorders; Ellen Kelly, Ph.D., of Vanderbilt University School of Medicine; speech-language consultants Frances Cook, MBE, MSc, Willie Botterill, MSc, and Elaine Kelman, MSc., from the Michael Palin Centre for Stammering Children in London.

"This is an important tool for families and teachers of children who stutter," added Jane Fraser, president of the nonprofit Stuttering Foundation. "Our latest DVD is designed to give parents and teachers the tools they need to play a vital role in the process of helping children who stutter.'

Ingredients

- 1 pound ground chuck (Jumbo Pack on sale \$1.99lb!)
- 1 egg white (Parade Grade A Large Dozen on sale \$0.69!)
- 1 small yellow onion, grated (about ½ cup)
- 1/2 teaspoon seasoning salt
- ½ teaspoon ground black pepper • 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 6 slices American cheese (Crystal Farms 12oz on sale \$1.99!) • 6 hamburger buns (seedless) (Sunbeam on sale 2/\$5.00!)
- Added condiments such as lettuce, tomato, pickles, and onions. (Iceberg

lettuce on sale \$1.19! Roma tomatoes on sale \$0.89lb!)

Secret Sauce

- 1/3 cup mayo
- 2 tablespoons ketchup • 2 teaspoons dill pickle relish
- 1 tsp. mustard
- 1/4 teaspoon paprika

Directions

TO MAKE SECRET SAUCE: Mix all of the 'secret sauce' ingredients in a bowl.

• Refrigerate until ready to use.

DIRECTIONS FOR BURGERS: In a large bowl, add ground beef, egg white, grated onion, Worcestershire sauce, seasoning salt and pepper. Using your hands or a fork, gently mix together.

- Shape mixture into 6 thin patties.
- Place patties on grill or skillet and cook until no longer pink on the inside. About 3-5 minutes per side. Place one piece of American cheese over the burgers during the last minute of grilling.
- Immediately remove from pan and transfer to waiting burger bun. Serve.



ourselves on continuing the traditions and values that started with John Kelly.


