ATTENTION

House Bill 2187 was signed by Gov. Abbott on June 19, 2015 and is effective September 1, 2015. This bill relates to the regulation of MRES; imposing an administrative penalty and amending provisions subject to criminal penalty. HB 2187 also requires MRES to issue cash transaction cards to any seller of regulated material being paid by cash or debit card. Cash transaction cards are non-transferable and the metal recycler will be required to keep copies of each application and a copy of each cash transaction card for two years. DPS has developed the Application for Cash Transaction Card for use by MRES. Unless a seller had been issued a cash transaction card, a recycler is only able to pay for a purchase of regulated material by check, money order or electronic funds transfer.

House of Mary Aims to Make Generational Impact

A new ministry has been creating a lot of buzz across social media platforms over the past few weeks. House of Mary, a future crisis pregnancy maternity home, announced their fundraising launch on August 1, and has gotten nothing but full support from every corner of Polk County. The new ministry even has supporters stretching from Kentucky, Hawaii, and the United Kingdom.

The mission at House of Mary (HOM) will be to equip, empower, and enable women and teens in crisis pregnancy situations to raise the "Timothy Generation." This concept is based on the biblical passage of 2 Timothy 1:5, "I have been reminded of your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice and, I am persuaded, now lives in you also." By offering expectant mothers a Christ-centered home environment, life skills classes, and community connections, HOM hopes to create a desire in them to provide more for their baby spiritually, mentally, physically, and emotionally.

The fundraising launch is "Phase 1" of many for HOM. During this phase they hope to raise enough funds to cover the majority of their start-up budget. This includes purchasing, building, or acquiring through donation two houses. State law does not permit housing minors and adults together, therefore they will need two separate houses in order to help expectant women of all ages. Funds raised during this time will also cover organization filing fees, utility set-up, and home repairs, among other expenses. Because HOM will be a Christ-centered ministry, all of their funding must come from generous donors and fundraising. Donations can be made online or mailed to House of Mary, P.O. Box 376, Livingston, TX 77351. A full list of financial needs (along with the option to donate) can be found on the HOM website, tackk.com/hom. So far, HOM has completed a successful t-shirt fundraising campaign and also has a benefit garage sale in the works for October 3.

HOM says their first priority is to bring glory to God and be obedient to His call. The committee members ask that the community join them in prayer and help spread the word as they launch this ministry. They believe HOM has the potential to change lives and impact generations to come. Republican Ernest Bailes Kicks Off Campaign for Texas House District 18

Raised in San Jacinto County on his family's dairy and beef cattle operation in Shepherd, Bailes learned the values of honest hard work at an early age. He earned a degree in Animal Science at Texas A&M University before building his company, Repro Select, from the ground up. Starting with nothing more than a solid work ethic, a computer in the corner of an old dairy barn and some second hand equipment, Bailes has grown Repro Select into a highly successful business that serves ranchers and whitetail deer breeders across Texas and the south-central U.S.

Bailes said he believes his business and life experiences make him uniquely qualified to represent District 18 in the State House. "I am level-headed and have proven business sense. I will bring a common sense approach to the legislative process and know how to build consensus without compromising what is right and wrong. This is a unique district," Bailes continued. "We are surrounded by urban areas, making it even more important to have a voice in Austin who understands business and hard work; someone who can bridge the gap between rural values and metropolitan commerce."

"I feel just as comfortable under a welding hood or working cattle as I do in a boardroom. I have never shied away from hard work. I think this diversity will serve us well in the legislature. I look forward to the opportunity to serve the citizens of Texas House District 18," Bailes concluded.

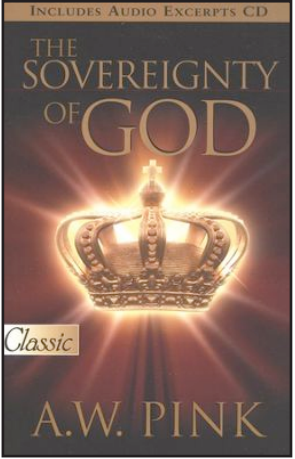
Retired School Personnel to Meet

BOOK REVIEW BY ROB MARSH

The Sovereignty of God
by A.W. Pink

Considered by many to be a reformed theological classic, the Sovereignty of God makes a powerful, Scripturally-dense argument for God's sovereign order and design in all aspects of creation, including salvation. If you are someone who is new to the doctrine of God's sovereign election (generally, if not completely accurately, referred to as “Calvinism”) this is the definitive work on the subject, rich with scriptural arguments from the Old and New testament to support God's predestinating of His elect. A.W. Pink carefully explores this doctrine, and I'll be the first to admit that this can be a difficult and challenging teaching to fully comprehend with our limited understanding, in comprehending the balance of God's election with human responsibility, but as Pink explains when there is any movement of the will, where there is any aspect of man's salvation that is “of me”, then this is falsely adding something else to the gospel and lapses into the false dogma of work's righteousness. Pink addresses some of the common objections and challenges frequently made with careful consideration, such as the idea that sovereign election could lead to a view of fatalistic indifference in the lives of a believer, but in understanding God's sovereignty with a scriptural approach, our attitude towards God and His election should be one of great rejoicing at his incredible mercy on undeserving sinners, inspiring in us godly fear, obedience and joy in our being chosen by God. Honesty, this isn't a light summer read, and requires a slow, careful study and examination of the Scriptures cited by Pink, and definitely deserves a repeated read, as it's rich in its teaching, and is of tremendous benefit to anyone wanting a better understanding of God's sovereignty in election.
