
Pirateers Reading Program at **Shepherd Primary School**Parents, grandparents, babysitters, and caregivers are invited to bring

Zika Virus Prevention

Texas has had 125 reported cases of Zika virus disease. Zika virus is primarily spread to people through mosquito bites. The virus can be spread from mother to child. Spread of the virus through blood transfusion and sexual contact has also been reported. Most Texas cases of Zika are related to travel abroad. People were bitten by an infected mosquito while traveling and then diagnosed after returning home. Most people infected with the virus have mild or no

symptoms. For those who do develop symptoms, illness is generally mild and typically lasts a few days to a week. The most common symptoms of Zika virus disease are fever, rash, joint pain, and conjunctivitis (red eyes).

Closer to home, the first reported case of Zika has been confirmed in

Currently there is no vaccine against the Zika virus. Citizens of San Jacinto County are encouraged to take preventative steps outlined by the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS).

Prevention is the best method to avoid contracting the virus. With all of the recent rain in the area, San Jacinto County Emergency Management Director, Judge John Lovett, recommends all county residents to follow the guidelines from the Texas Department of State Health Services, which has several tips for preventing mosquito breeding and how to protect yourself from getting bitten by mosquitoes, including:

- At least weekly empty or get rid of cans, buckets, old tires, pots, plant saucers and other containers that hold water.
- Keep gutters clear of debris and standing water.
- Remove standing water around structures and from flat roofs.
- Change water in pet dishes daily.
- Rinse and scrub vases and other indoor water containers weekly.
- Change water in wading pools and bird baths several times a week.
- Maintain backyard pools or hot tubs. • Cover trash containers.
- · Water lawns and gardens carefully so water does not stand for
- several days. Screen rain barrels and openings to water tanks or cisterns.
- Treat front and back door areas of homes with residual insecticides if mosquitoes are abundant nearby.
- If mosquito problems persist, consider pesticide applications for vegetation around the home. • Wear Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)-registered insect
- repellents. When used as directed, these insect repellents including those that contain DEET — are proven safe and effective even for pregnant and breastfeeding women. Mosquito repellent is now available as a Medicaid benefit.
- Cover up with long-sleeved shirts and long pants.
- Keep mosquitoes out with air conditioning or intact window screens.
- Limit outdoor activities during peak mosquito times. For more information about how to prevent the spread of the Zika virus, visit www.texaszika.org.



9ngredients

- 2 cans beef broth • 1/2 cup fresh lemon juice
- 1 1/2 cup soy sauce
- 5 cloves chopped garlic
- 2 tablespoons liquid smoke
- 10 pound beef brisket (on sale \$2.99lb!)



Directions

- Combine first five ingredients in large roasting pan (a disposable is just fine). Place brisket in the marinade, fat side up. Cover tightly with foil. Marinate in refrigerator for 24-48 hours. When ready to cook, place pan covered in foil into a 300-degree oven. Cook brisket for approximately 40 minutes per pound.
- When fork-tender, transfer whole brisket to a cutting board. Slice against the grain and place slices back into the cooking liquid. Serve immediately, spooning juice over the slices. Barbeque sauce may be used, if preferred. (Kraft BBQ sauce on sale 5/\$5.00!)
- You may store pan in fridge for up to two days or freeze for use at a later date. If fat collects and hardens at the top, remove and discard.
- Brisket is great with mashed potatoes, with the juice spooned over the top. It's also great on a sandwich with melted cheese.


