Media Release for Free and Reduced-Price Meals

Shepherd Independent School District announced its policy today for providing free and reduced-price meals for children served under the attached current income eligibility guidelines. Each school/site or the central office has a copy of the policy, which may be reviewed by anyone on request.

Starting on August 24, 2015, Shepherd Independent School District will begin distributing letters to the households of the children in the district Shepherd about eligibility benefits and any actions households need to take to apply for these benefits. Applications also are available at Shepherd Independent School District Child Nutrition Office at 1401 South Byrd Avenue, Shepherd Texas 77371.

Criteria for Free and Reduced-Price Meal Benefits: The following criteria will be used to determine a child’s eligibility for free or reduced-price meal benefits:

Income:

1. Household income that is at or below the income eligibility levels
Categorical or Automatic Eligibility
2. Household receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF); or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR)
Program Participant
3. Child’s status as a foster child, homeless, runaway, migrant, or displaced by a declared disaster
4. Child’s enrollment in Head Start or Even Start

Income Eligibility: For those households that qualify for free or reduced-price meals based on income, an adult in the household must fill out free and reduced-price meal application and return it to Oleta Rushing, Child Nutrition Coordinator, (936) 628-2923. Those individuals filling out the application will need to provide the following information:

1. Names of all household members
2. Amount, frequency, and source of current income for each household member
3. Last 4 digits of the Social Security number of the adult household member who signs the application or, if the adult does not have a social security number, check the box for
“No Social Security number”
4. Signature of an adult household member attesting that the information provided is correct

Categorical or Program Eligibility: Shepherd Independent School District is working with local agencies to identify all children who are categorically and program eligible. Shepherd Independent School District will notify the households of these children that they do not need to complete an application. Any household that does not receive a letter and feels it should have should contact Oleta Rushing, Child Nutrition Coordinator, (936) 628-2923. Any household that wishes to decline benefits should contact Oleta Rushing, Child Nutrition Coordinator, (936) 628-2923.

Applications may be submitted anytime during the school year. The information households provide on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may also be verified by the school officials at any time during the school year.

Determining Eligibility: Under the provisions of the free and reduced-price meal policy, Oleta Rushing, Child Nutrition will review applications and determine eligibility. Households or guardians dissatisfied with the Reviewing Official’s eligibility determination may wish to discuss the decision with the Reviewing Official on an informal basis. Households wishing to make a formal appeal for a hearing on the decision may make a request either orally or in writing to Steve Pierce, Superintendent, 1401 South Byrd Avenue Shepherd, Texas 77371, (936) 628-2900

Unexpected Circumstances: If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size increases, the household should contact the school. Such changes may make the children of the household eligible for benefits if the household’s income falls at or below the attached current income eligibility guidelines.

Parent or legal guardian must be present with the student.

- Official Birth Certificate (Not a hospital copy)
- Social Security Card. If it has been lost, a copy of the letter from the Social Security Administration Office showing that it has been applied for. It must show the child’s name and social security number.
- Updated Shot Records (Must meet the State of Texas guidelines)
- Accepted Proof of Residence. (1.) Utility Bill, which includes lights or water. (2.) NOTARIZED Shepherd ISD Residence Statement for minor student showing that the student(s) and parent(s) live in someone else’s home. This form may be obtained from the campuses.
- Enrollment Packet completed, front and back, signed by parent.
- Copy of enrolling parent’s Driver’s License or State ID.
- Custody/Guardianship Papers, if applicable.
- Withdrawal form from the last school your child attended, if applicable.
- Final report if applicable.

No registration will be held August 18th.





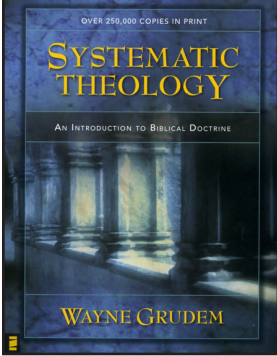
TO OUR VOLUNTEERS: We love you and want you to know how special you are to us and our community. Your dedication helps keep us operating efficiently. What a great job you do!!

Book Review by Rob Marsh

Systematic Theology:
An Introduction to Biblical Doctrine
by Wayne Grudem



Wayne Grudem's "Systematic Theology" is a monumental work that is such a wealth of sound Biblical theology and doctrinal that I would consider this one of the top Christian theology books available. Not only should this work be in the office of every pastor who loves God's word, but this deserves a place in the home of any Christian who wants a deeper, richer understanding of God's word taught in a clear, informative manner and saturated with Scripture. At around 1,200 pages its packed with an excellent systematic overview of key Christian doctrines such as the Bible, the nature of God, the church, and Christ's redemptive work, etc. Dr. Grudem's teaching is clear and easy to follow, and this work, among other things, is an ideal supplement that fathers can incorporate into family worship time in the home. Each topical section is rich in detail and well-referenced from both the Bible and from numerous theological works and various other systematic theologies. I can't even begin to imagine the time that was put into this. Dr. Grudem will end chapters with a bibliography of different works, special terms, Scripture memory passages and even a hymn, again emphasizing the value this holds in using this book for family worship time.

Dr. Grudem is thorough in the various topics of systematic theology covered and also takes time to address potential arguments and objections and soundly counters these with Scriptural refutation. Again, if you are a believer looking for an invaluable resource in growing deeper in your walk with Christ then I would highly recommend Dr. Grudem's Systematic Theology.
