Pirates Break Twelve Year Streak in Battle of San Jacinto County

The Shepherd Pirates and the Coldspring-Oakhurst Trojans met on the Trojan field for their annual "Battle of San Jacinto County" football game on September 2, 2016. For the past 12 years the Trojans have won the game, but this all changed in the second half of the game when the Pirates came out on top, 37-33.

The first half of the game belonged to the Trojans, who dominated 33-7 but the Pirates returned with renewed vigor in the second half of the game before Devonte Hamilton brought the ball in for a touchdown with just north of 30 seconds left in the game, giving the team just what they needed to win.

With an exciting first victory in the season and breaking a twelve year losing streak against the Trojans, Pirate Athletic Director Miles Robison commends the Trojans for giving them a tough game. "That team played hard," said Robison. "It was a battle." Robison says the Pirates are eager to continue the season, having now proven themselves amidst losing a number of key players from last year's season, including Royce See, Cedric Green, Jonathan Marshall and more. "It just puts us in a step in the right direction," said Robison.

The Pirates are not expected to make any major strategic changes at this time, but are going to be focusing on practicing as much as they can to sharpen their skills. "The rain has just destroyed our practice time," said Robison. "We're going to keep doing what we're doing." Trojan Athletic Director Mark Byrd praised the Pirates for their victory, describing the game as a tale of two halves. "We didn't execute the second half of the game," he said. "They beat us physically the second half and they made big plays that we didn't make."

Byrd says the Trojans showed strong dominance in the first half, but did not understand that there are two halves to a game. "We came out guns blazing and then the gun ran out," he said. The Trojans are going to work diligently on the three phases of football, which include offense, defense and kicking. "We've got to have the offensive line matter, and defensively we were very soft the second half," said Byrd. Byrd says another aspect the Trojans are going to be focusing on for their upcoming game on Friday with the Liberty Panthers is passing. "We've got to establish the passing game," he said.

SLOW COOKER CHICKEN AND DUMPLINGS

Ongredients

- 4 boneless, skinless chicken breast halves (Family Pack chicken breasts on sale \$1.88lb!) • 2 cans (10.5 oz.) condensed cream of chicken
- soup, undiluted • 1 can (14.5 oz.) chicken broth
- 1 soup can of water (use empty soup can to measure)
- 2 tubes (10.5 oz. each) refrigerated biscuit
- dough, torn into pieces (Pillsbury Grands biscuits 16oz on sale \$0.99!)
- 1/4 teaspoon poultry seasoning
- 1/4 teaspoon paprika
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper • Chopped parsley, for serving (optional)

- Directions • Place the chicken in the slow cooker. Sprinkle with poultry seasoning, paprika, and pepper.
- In medium bowl, whisk together the two cans of soup, chicken broth, and water; pour the mixture over the chicken in the slow cooker.
- Cover and cook for 5-6 hours on HIGH.
- About 90 minutes before serving, remove the chicken from the slow cooker and roughly chop into pieces. Return the chicken to the slow cooker. Add the torn biscuit dough, pressing down gently to make sure they are all submerged. Cook until the dough is no longer raw in the center. • To serve, sprinkle with chopped parsley.


