Marijuana Field Found in San Jacinto County

On the morning of September 9, 2015, San Jacinto County Sheriff Greg Capers and Chief Deputy Joe Schultea were notified by agents with the DEA and DPS Tasks Force of a marijuana field in San Jacinto County.

A Marijuana Eradication Task Force was organized and included San Jacinto County Sheriff's Office Tactical Patrol Unit, Polk County Sheriff's Office, Lufkin Police Department, Angelina County Sheriff's Office, and members of the DEA and DPS.

The marijuana field was found by DEA and DPS during a flyover. After all of the fields were located in Polk County several months back, routine fly overs have become regular in our area.





The field was at the end of Pleasant Valley Road off of FM 3278. The filed was located in a small clearing just off of the main road. It was discovered that the water for irrigation was being provided by a homested on Pleasant Vally Rd. The plant count is estimated to be approximately 15,000 at the time of this report.



The marijuana plants were cut and air lifted by helicopter to a field near Browders on FM 3278 just below the lake. An investigation into the suspects involved in the growing and harvesting of this marijuana field is still underway




