Lizzie's Book Shelf

Reason to Breathe

466 pages

Summary: "No one tried to get involved with me, and I kept to myself. This was the place where everything was supposed to be safe and easy. How could Evan Mathews unravel my constant universe in just one day?"

In the affluent town of Weslyn, Connecticut, where most people worry about what to be seen in and who to be seen with, Emma Thomas would rather not be seen at all. She's more concerned with feigning perfection—pulling down her sleeves to conceal the bruises, not wanting anyone to know how far from perfect her life truly is. Without expecting it, she finds love. It challenges her to recognize her own worth—at the risk of revealing the terrible secret she's desperate to hide.

My Review: I am literally can't even-ing. I am one hot mess right now. One. Hot. Mess. If I would've realized I was getting on an emotional roller coaster instead of just reading a book, I may have prepared myself a little better. I laughed, cried, felt my heart pound and suppressed extreme desires to do violence. I was a ball of anxiety throughout this entire book. And I couldn't put it down.

Although I don't like Emma's decisions, especially as it pertains to the abuse she suffers at home, I still like her as a character. Some things were a little overly done, she's a little "too perfect" and a lot too perfectly oblivious to her perfection. But I guess that *could* make sense after what she goes through.

And Carol, or as I like to call her, The Devil. (See above for my violence suppression reference). She is absolutely atrocious. No wait, what's worse than atrocious? Because that's what she is. I haven't felt so much hatred for a character in a book since Dolores Umbridge from Harry Potter.

But there is always Evan. Evan is every high school girls dream guy. He is funny, handsome and sweet. The torturously slow pace of their relationship had me wanting to throw my kindle against a wall. But thankfully I refrained, and all that built up angst made the second half of the book that much better.

I am giving you fair warning that this book is pretty intense and although it could be considered a kind of love story, it also centers around abuse. If that bothers you at all you may not want to read this book. Also, since I'm issuing warnings, you should know that this ends in a horrendous cliffhanger. Yes...HORRENDOUS. Be prepared to have the second book, Barely Breathing, ready to go.

Parental Guidance: 14-17 years (BN.com). I would recommend this book for mature teens. There is talk of intimacy and a few semi-heavy kissing scenes and also some profanity spread out through the book.

Stand Alone or Series: This is the first book in the *Breathing* trilogy. The second book is titled *Barely Breathing* and the third book is titled *Out of Breath*.

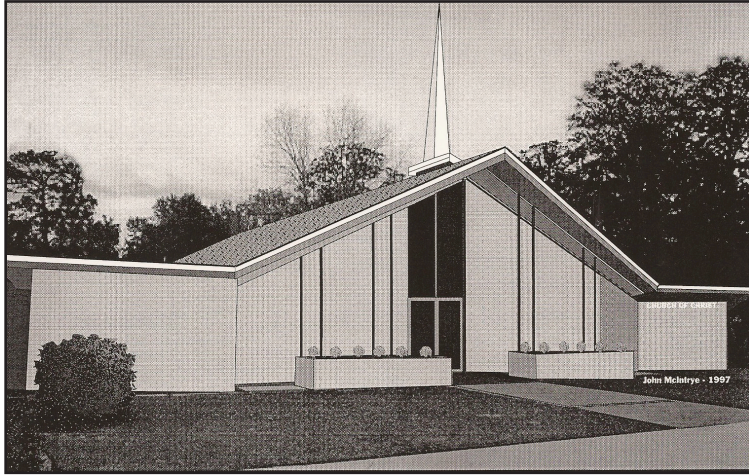

Stuttering: For Kids By Kids

Kids who stutter have a lot to say, and friends can show them how in *Stuttering: For Kids By Kids*, a DVD in English and Spanish starring kids who stutter, available at most public libraries or through interlibrary loan.

Many children who stutter have never met others who struggle with the same disability. In this DVD from the Stuttering Foundation, they meet kids who recount how they handle challenges such as teasing, speaking out in class, and teaching others about stuttering.

Swish, a lively and engaging animated basketball character designed by students at Purdue University, narrates the DVD. The children, who range in age from first-graders to high school students, offer frank and sometimes differing views of stuttering.

For example, Matthew, age 10, says about his speech difficulties, "It's no big deal," but Kate, age 9, worries about talking, what is going to happen next and whether or not she'll stutter. Arianne, age 14, says, "The hardest part about stuttering is to get through it and to stay in there when you're stuck." Umang, age 12, agrees, "Sometimes it gets kind of annoying when you want to say something and you can't. I also get worried what other people might think if I do stutter and wonder if I'll be able to get out of my blocks and things."

"All those interested in helping kids learn more about stuttering will want to see this tape," said speech-language pathologist Bill Murphy of Purdue University. "The children featured are a perfect example of how to openly and honestly handle stuttering." "This is an important tool for families and teachers of kids who stutter," added Jane Fraser, president of the nonprofit Stuttering Foundation.

Other professionals and specialists in stuttering in this production include Kristin Chmela of Northwestern University, Joe Donaher of Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, Lisa Scott of Florida State University, and Lee Caggiano of Friends.

The Foundation has provided free materials to over 8,700 public libraries nationwide. A library that will shelve them can download a request form at <http://www.stutteringhelp.org/libraries-information>.

Lemon Chicken Scallopini with Spinach

Ingredients

- 1 large lemon
- 4 thin-sliced skinless, boneless chicken breasts halves (*on sale \$1.69lb!*)
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1 tbsp. olive oil
- 3/4 cup low sodium chicken broth
- 1 (10.75oz) can cream of celery soup
- 4 cups fresh baby spinach (*Fresh Express on sale 2/\$5.00!*)



Directions

1. Grate 1 teaspoon zest and squeeze 1/4 cup juice from the lemon.
2. Heat the oil in a 12-inch skillet over medium-high heat. Add the chicken and cook for 10 minutes or until well browned on both sides and cooked through. Remove the chicken from the skillet, cover and keep warm.
3. Stir the garlic, stock, lemon juice, lemon zest and soup in the skillet. Add the spinach and cook and stir until the spinach is wilted. Return the chicken to the skillet.
